# **ABOUT US**



### **MAP ELA DATA**



The Reading Growth data shows a median growth percentile of 55th, indicating that students are growing at a slightly above-average rate. In Winter 2024-2025, the achievement median percentile was 33rd. In Spring 2024-2025, it improved slightly to 37th, but it remains below the national average (50th percentile)

#### **MAP MATH DATA**



The Math Growth data indicates a median growth percentile of 35th, which is below the national average (50th percentile). Achievement levels are currently very low: In Winter 2024-2025, the achievement median percentile was 23rd. In Spring 2024-2025, it further declined to 19th.
