## General Information

The School Improvement Council (SIC) works in conjunction with the Title I committee and PTO executive board to develop goals and plan activities to make Redcliffe Elementary School a place where opportunities are provided for parents, educators, and community members to achieve academically, socially, and professionally.

The overall goal for Redcliffe is to improve student achievement. The SIC/PTO/Title I Committee believe that parent involvement, character education for students, and professional development for teachers are essential to improving student achievement.

This year's goals have been addressed by providing funding for Red Ribbon Week, a new sound system and parent involvement activities such as the Family Fun Festival, Daddy/Daughter & Mother/Son dances, 5th grade's etiquette luncheon, and Good Citizen Awards. Assistance in reaching these goals has also been provided by using Title I funds to hire teachers in order to maintain small class sizes, providing professional development for teachers through conferences, workshops, and literature, and enhancing parent involvement through such activities as parent/child workshops such as Edventure.

## Report Card Information

The Absolute Rating for Redcliffe Elementary School compared to elementary schools with students like ours is AVERAGE.

The Improvement Rating for Redcliffe Elementary School compared to elementary schools with students like ours is Average which is up from the 2010 rating of Below Average.

Redcliffe Elementary School met 17 out of 17 objectives, which is also an improvement from the previous year's results. Redcliffe demonstrated improvement and met Adequate Yearly Progress.
