- Continued utilization of our full time Reading Coach and full time Reading Interventionist as a part of Read to Succeed.



Curriculum at a Glance

- Various data points are analyzed throughout the year to identify students' strengths and weaknesses to target those particular areas during small group instruction
- I-Ready, Prodigy, and Epic (computer assisted instruction) are used to supplement classroom instruction in reading and math. Students access these through iPads
- After School Clubs for students included The Book Club, Girls STEM Club, Gifted and Talented Chorus, and the Bible Club
- A part time ESL teacher is employed to provide interventions for ESL students in grades K-6
- 1 full time reading interventionists and 1 part-time interventionist are employed to provide intensive instruction for students in 5K-6th grades
- Continuation of Project Lead the Way, an inquiry based science and engineering curriculum, in our 5K-5th grades
- Read Across America Week featured Dr. Seuss themed STEM activities in all grades

School Environment

- The Girls STEM Club and PLTW modules expose our students to hands on inquiry strategies
- Quarterly Celebrations of Learning are held to recognize students for academic achievement
- IPads, Laptops, Chromebooks, and ActivPanel displays continue to be purchased to enhance our use of visual and interactive educational technology
- A new front entrance door was put in to increase school safety
- A part-time School Resource Officer (SRO) was hired
- JCLES will be implementing the Leader in Me in the upcoming school year to promote leadership skills for all students
- JCLES will open the first Montessori program in FSD3 for 3, 4, and 5 year olds in 2019-2020. We are completing preparations for this program.

Home School Relations

- Communication to parents includes a school website, the JCL Facebook page, School Messenger, a monthly school newsletter, and flyers
- Parental events are held throughout the year which include events such as an Annual Open House,
 Technology night, Book Fairs, Parent/Teacher Conference Night, a Fall Carnival, Literacy and STEM Nights, and chorus concerts
- Parent Academy sessions are held in the fall and spring to provide parents with assistance in various topics such as homework, information about standards and the district grading/attendance policies. In addition, JCLES holds Academia Para Padres, which is a Spanish Parent Academy for our Hispanic parents and includes English instruction
- Our PTO is also very active in our school and community to help sponsor events such as our Fall Carnival, a Spring Fling for students, the Penguin Patch Holiday Shop, the Beta Club convention, and Teacher/Staff appreciation activities
