

#### District Initiatives

- This year the JCL leadership team added Mrs. Tisdale as assistant principal and Mrs. Shaluta as ELA master teacher.
- All schools in Florence District 3 became accredited with Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.
- JCL was designated a School of Choice resulting in the enrollment of 75 additional students.



### A REVIEW of OUR YEAR

#### Curriculum

- PASS, MAP, Dominie Reading, and math benchmark test data were analyzed to identify student strengths and to target weaknesses in reading and math,
- Goal setting conferences were held with students to establish performance goals for the next testing session.
- Students participated in Classworks Lab, our computer assisted learning program, once a week.
- Math instruction was enhanced with student subscriptions to First in Math – a web-based math program to practice and refine student understanding of basic math skills.

- TAG instruction was provided at Main St.
   Elementary School due to the limited space and JCL.
- Twelve Power Words were studied as a means to increase student understanding of these words when seen on various tests.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> grade students received weekly classes in character education and media/research skills.

#### School Environment

- Wireless internet was installed throughout all of the school.
- Students meeting one or two of their MAP goals were recognized for their achievement.
- Two additional teachers and two additional teacher assistants were hired to accommodate student needs.
- The school was a recipient of the SC Fresh Fruits and Vegetables Grant that allowed students to sample typical and unusual fruits and vegetables on a daily basis.

#### Home School Connections

- Our character education program included a monthly character trait focus presented in the newsletter.
- Communication to parents included newsletters in English and Spanish, school website, marquee, and PowerPoint announcements on DVD, and automated phone calls.
- Parents participated in various activities including Grandparents Day Breakfast, Dads are Our Hearts Day, Moms Count Too Day, and many other exciting events!
