In addition, the program includes a homework center and an afternoon snack. OES provides an Early Bird program for targeted students from 7:10 a.m. to 7:40 a.m. each school morning. Students in both programs receive additional opportunities for computer assisted instruction with the I-Ready Math & Reading computer program.



Technology @ Olanta

- Additional laptops & ipads were purchased increasing our 1:1 technology opportunities
- There is a mobile laptop cart that is available for checkout to all classes.
- The OES computer lab currently has 28 computers available for classroom lab times and enrichment blocks.
- Each classroom has 4-6 computers available for student use during instruction as well as a part of a class' station rotation.
- Each classroom is equipped with a Promethean Board which provides increased opportunities for hands-on interactive and integrated technology
- We have begun to equip classrooms with Promethean Activpanels which are the updated version of the Promethean Board
- Early Bird and Afterschool programs provide additional opportunities for computer assisted instruction with our I-Ready Math & Reading computer program
- We have begun to purchased Cleartouch Interactive Panel board tables which increases opportunities for personalized learning



Personalized Learning

OES believes in meeting the needs of each individual student. OES accomplishes this through small group instruction, one to one interventions, teacher/student conferencing

in Reading and Writing as well as instruction that is data driven. In addition, OES has a daily enrichment block built into its school wide schedule which provides for additional small group and individual instruction based upon the individual students need. Furthermore, student interest surveys are conducted at various times during the year to ensure student interest is considered when planning for instruction and purchasing such items as station supplies/materials and books.
