The school is raising funds for the playground and will continue to do so. Events throughout the next few years will contribute to the funds for this project.

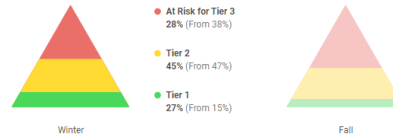
Community Outreach

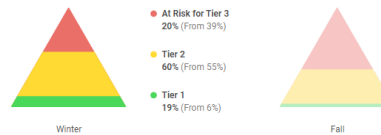
iReady Reading-Winter and Fall K-5

Intervention

Students needing extra support in literacy and math will receive in class or pull out Tier 2 or Tier 3 interventions in order to build foundational skills.

After-School
