Additional Information

Kensington Elementary School is one of ten elementary schools located in the rural area of Georgetown County, just outside of the Georgetown City limits. Georgetown is mostly a factory/industrial town whose population consists primarily of blue-collar workers. According to the 2019-2020 school report card, Kensington has a population of 606 total students (295 male and 311 female). 73.25% of students are considered poverty level, 11.39% of learners have disabilities, and more that 10% are Limited English Proficient learners. Kensington's demographics for 2019-2020 were 277 white, 241 black, 67 Hispanic, 6 Asian, 1 American Indian/Alaska Native, and 14 that identified as 2 or more races.
