### **SIC Annual Goals**

This has been another challenging year here at KES due to the global pandemic. Being unable to meet and have visitors/groups on the campus for face-to-face meetings has slowed our progress just a little. However, Kensington Elementary School Improvement Council was proud to announce last year that one of our long-term goals, an Inclusion Playground for our Special Needs population, was completed.

An inclusive playground is one that invites and welcomes everyone! It is sensory rich, promotes social play, and has multiple levels of challenging activities.

### **I-Ready Reading**

Reading Tier 1 status increased 19.8% from beginning of the year (BOY) to 31.2% middle of the year (MOY).

### **I-Ready Math**

Math Tier 1 status increased 13.2% from beginning of the year (BOY) to 28.8 middle of the year (MOY).

## **DIBELS (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills)**

KES had 33% of students in grades K-2 on grade level at the BOY. MOY DIBELS data indicated 40% of students were on grade level. Our aim is for 50% of our students in grades K-2 to be on grade level by the End of the Year (EOY).

### **Additional Information**

Kensington Elementary School is one of ten elementary schools located in the rural area of Georgetown County, just outside of the Georgetown City limits. Georgetown is mostly a factory/industrial whose population town consists primarily of blue-collar workers. Kensington has a population of 532 students (239 male and 293 female). 71.25% of students are considered poverty level, 11.39% of learners have disabilities, and more than 9%% are Limited English Proficient learners. Kensington's demographics for 2021-22 is 256 white, 196 black, 57 Hispanic, 1 Asian, 2 American Indian/Alaska Native, and 16 that identified as 2 or more races.
