


## Strategies for Improvement

- PES analyzed scholar achievement results from last years' SC READY/SC PASS test and identified areas of improvement .
- MAP (measures academic progress) test data from the fall, winter and spring in the areas of reading and math as well as benchmark test data for science and social studies to analyze achievement results and made necessary instructional changes.
- Professional staff development opportunities are targeted around our students achievements data.
- Teachers set scholars' learning objectives for each scholar based on students' past performance data. Progress towards these learning goals was monitored through formative assessment and instructional motivation made as needed to the instructional program.
- PTO purchased gift cards and various incentives for scholars for academic improvements and behavior.
- Plantersville Enrichment Academy has been providing virtual tutoring services for our scholars afterschool in core subjects.

## Our Performance Goals

- ◆ The percentage of students in grades 3 through 5 who would score Met and Exceeds in Math as measured by SC READY will increase to 50% by May 2022.
- ◆ The percentage of students in grades 3 through 5 who score Met and Exceed in ELA as measured by SC READY ELA will increase to 35% by 2022.
- ◆ The percentage of students in grades 3 through 5 who score Met and Exceed in Social Studies as measured by SC PASS Social Studies will increase to 35% by May 2022.
- ◆ The percentage of students grades 3 through 5 who score Met and Exceed in Science as measured by PASS SC Science will increase to 41% by May 2022.
- ◆ The percentage of students satisfied with the social and physical environment at school will increase to 100% in May 2022.
- ◆ The percentage of teachers satisfied with the school-home relationship will increase to 85% in May 2022.
