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Strategies for Improvement:

- 1. PES analyzed student achievement results from last years' PASS test and identified areas where improvement was needed.
- 2. We MAP (measures of academic progress) test data from the fall and spring in the areas of reading and math, as well as benchmark test data for science and social studies, to analyze achievement results and make necessary instructional changes.
- 3. We strengthened and continued our literacy program utilizing comprehension strategies in all academic and exploratory classes.
- 4. We designed professional staff development opportunities targeted around our student achievement data.
- 6. Teachers set student learning objectives for each student based on students' past performance data. Progress toward these learning goals was monitored through formative assessment and instructional changes were made when necessary.
- 7. In addition to analyzing test data, we focused on direct instruction, differentiation, provided regular progress reports, and maintained communication with parents regarding attendance and achievement.
- 8. We have reinforced our emphasis on professional learning teams by hosting subject area and grade level meetings.
- 9. We have purchased the Compass Learning program. This computerized program provides additional instruction and practice for students in the areas of reading and math based on each students' individual MAP data.
- 10. We have adopted the Everyday Math Curriculum to provide students with hands-on learning experiences in math. Teachers have participated in professional development with this new curriculum throughout the year.

Current Data

At present, we have not completed MAP for the spring of this school year. We will be taking the SCREADY test for the first time this year in grades 3-5.

Eighty-two percent of our students improved their MAP Math scores from this fall to winter. Seventy-eight percent of our students improved their MAP reading scores from this fall to winter.

New Additions to Our Campus

Each year we attempt to provide additions to our school environment that will enhance the quality of life for our students, staff, and parents. Several of our classrooms have been painted this year. We have also gone from carpet to tile throughout the building. We added more technology to our campus in the form of laptops, desktop computers, projectors, and new Promethean Boards. Finally, in order to enhance safety and security in our building we underwent a front-office renovation.
