#### **Student Achievement**


- WMS was recognized with an Excellent Rating on our 2022-2023 SC School Report Card—moving up 24 points from the previous Average rating.
- 25 Warriors scored a Perfect Score on the Algebra I EOC test in 2022-2023. 10 Warriors had perfect scores on SC Ready tests.
- 11 Warriors were selected as the SC Junior Scholars for their performance on the PSAT.

#### Service

- Our Warriors raised over \$9,000 for our school through the World's Finest Chocolate Fundraiser.
- ♦ We collected 4,625 Canned Goods donated to the local Baskervill Food Pantry in Pawleys Island.
- Our WMS team took the Polar Plunge and won the "Coolest School" - raising \$2,250 for SC Special Olympics in February—the most among GCSD schools.
- WMS raised over \$6,500 for Alejandro Bernal-Rincon—an 8th Grade student battling cancer.

#### Athletics

- WMS B-Team Football were the winners of the HTC Member Bowl between Horry and Georgetown Counties.

# Our Goals: 2023 - 2024 School Year

Using data from our 2023 Annual SC School Report Card, our SC READY Statewide Assessments and our AdvancEd Survey information, our SIC Team developed the following goals for the 2023-2024 School Year.

**GOAL 1:** <u>We will foster a school environment and hold high standards that push our Warriors to show significant</u> growth on our SC Ready Statewide Assessments.

We expect the progress made by students at WMS to reflect the projections below

Ultimately, our goal is to achieve 80% proficiency in the above assessments within the next three years.

**GOAL 2:** <u>100% of our Professional Staff will receive appropriate staff development that is designed to enhance student achievement</u>.

A characteristic of any high-achieving school is preparing the staff to address the data-driven needs of our students and target direct instruction. Throughout the 2023 - 2024 year, our teaching staff attended weekly PLCs where teachers were guided through data analysis and identified the strategies and instruction needed with the support of our Instructional Coach. In addition, our administration and professional staff had the opportunity to attend mean-ingful educational conferences. When our teachers are at their best—they will be at their best for our students.

**GOAL 3:** <u>The percentage of meaningful feedback from our Community and Parent Survey will increase from</u> <u>11% to 90% within the next three years AND our parent/family satisfaction rate will increase from 68% to 85%</u> <u>within the next three years.</u>

Without meaningful feedback from our stakeholders, parents, and community members, our school cannot properly address the needs of our students. We plan on communicating with and involving all stakeholders using the following activities: Back to School Orientation tours; Vision, Data, and iReady Night; technology education sessions for parents and guardians; increasing positive teacher-to-home communication with the use of positive post-cards; utilizing technology to keep parents and families informed on student progress; keeping our school's social media accounts and newsletters current with the achievements of our students and the great things happening at WMS.

# Our SIC Success: 2023 - 2024 School Year

At Waccamaw Middle School, we truly believe that the strength of our school contributes to the strength of our community and vice versa. We have recognized and identified academic and social deficits within our school resulting from the challenges in education over the past few years. The goal for the SIC this year was to gain more parent participation on the Parent Climate Survey and communicate with our parents regarding the changes that are happening within education and within our school building.

In 2023, WMS had 11% of parents complete the Parent Climate Survey. This parent involvement helps to bridge the communication gap between the school and parents and allows the school to know what areas to improve upon based on the parent feedback. WMS is on the path to hit 50% of parents to complete the Parent Climate Survey for 2024 and we could not be more excited! WMS has made significant progress with this goal and we continue to strive for improvement in all areas to create a learning environment where students are safe, happy, and learning. We enjoy watching our students flourish in academics, arts, athletics, community service, and leadership. We will continue to implement rigorous course offerings, and we are proud to offer the quality educational programs all students deserve.
