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Bulldog 2022 Recap

The 2021-2022 school started a little differently than last year, but with the same challenge of COVID looming over our heads. Things are getting closer to normal; however, students still need a lot of remediation in order to catch up to grade level learning.

In order to meet the needs of students who need remediation we have added the following services:

- Tutoring free of charge three days a week
- Relearn/redo program that give students the opportunity to redo a major assessment if they would like to improve their grade.
- Content Recovery system that allows students to complete an online instructional program, using Edgenuity, to replace a failing quarterly grade with a 60.
- Credit Recovery program for students to repeat a class using an online program, such as Edgenuity or SC Virtual.
- Summer school is also an option for students who failed a class.

We have also want to recognize and thank our corporate partners: United Way and United Way partner organizations, Fairway Subaru, Michelin North America, GE, The Blood Connection, and the SC National Guard. We hosted 10 community organizations at our back to school orientation. Harvest Hope provided food baskets for parents, and The United Way supplied free backpacks with school supplies for our students.

Fairway Subaru of Greenville adopted six classrooms this year and provided \$500 grants to first year teachers so they could get much-needed supplies. Engineers from Michelin North America and GE volunteered time to build a retaining walls in front of our school.

2021-2022 School Goals

GOAL 1

We will increase College/Career readiness rate by 10 %.

- Each student will have a counselor that follows them through graduation, helping them develop the skills necessary for success after high school.
- Add OSHA certification to career and technology classes.
- Through the Individual Graduation Plan process, help students identify and develop career goals and action plans to accomplish those goals.

GOAL 2


The on-time graduation rate will reach 76% .
