Bulldog Celebrations

- Berea Alumna Betsey Bishop was named to the inaugural class of the Greenville County Schools Hall of Fame.

- Friends of Berea and our student body raised \$35,000 to buy track equipment this year, allowing us to host our first home track meet in sixteen years.
- The Berea High soccer team won the Region II AAA title for the second year in a row, and followed that up with the AAA boys' soccer state championship on May 13, 2017. Wilbert Perez was named Boy's Soccer athlete of the year by the Greenville News. Coach Casida was named region coach of the year.
- Senior Kennedy Dennis was crowned AAA State champion in track in the 100 and 200 meter dashes. She has won seven individual state championships in three years. She was also named AAA track athlete of year by the Greenville News and state track athlete of the year.
- Eight out of ten team sports at Berea made the playoffs this year. Basketball made it to the upper state title game, and soccer won the state championship.
- Junior Angel Reese's artwork was featured in a recent issue of *TOWN Magazine*.
- BHS College and Career Academy is finishing its second year of implementation. Students spend their freshman year learning about themselves and researching careers to match their interests and abilities. They create a ten-year plan to track progress toward meeting their goals.
- As the next step of implementing the college and career academy, BHS will offer several dual-credit courses next year in conjunction with Greenville Technical College. Students will have the opportunity to receive both high school and college credit for courses in math and English.
- BHS biology teacher Alison Koutroulias has been named Outstanding Science Teacher in Greenville County.
- Berea High student tutors tutored fifteen elementary school student throughout the school year.
- Our Teacher Cadets did internships at four area elementary schools working in classrooms helping other students learn.
- Berea's Air Force JROTC unit has been recognized as a national distinguished unit for thirteen years in a row.
- Senior Jasmine Sweet has been named Microsoft Excel state champion due to her high score on the MOS certification exam. She will compete for a national championship in Orlando, FL this summer.
- Twelve Berea High students were inducted into Berea's chapter of the National Art Honor Society this year.
- The foreign language department received an excellent rating on the State Modern and Classical Language Association Program Assessment.

The on-time graduation rate will reach 83% .

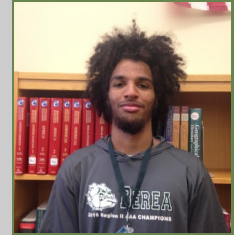
