

Bulldog Celebrations

- Berea High School has been selected as the winner of the William "Bill" T. Wylie VALUED Lives Award for School Excellence in Diversity.
- Junior Savannah Karkkanen has been named a National Merit Finalist because she scored within the top one percent of students in the United States on the PSAT.
- The Berea High boys' soccer team won the Region II AAA title for the third year in a row, and followed that up with their second AAA boys' soccer state championship in 2018.
- The Berea High girls' soccer team went to the playoffs for the first time in school history in 2018.
- The Berea girls' basketball team won the Region championship in 2018 for the first time in 20 years.
- Jada Robinson was named Region II AAA Track Athlete of the Year, and trach coach Stephen Redmond was named Region II AAA Track Coach of the Year in 2018.
- Jashiya Henderson and Ta'mious Cunningham-Young were both named to the All-State basketball team in 2018.
- Football player Adam Henderson was named upper-state lineman of the year and was named to the Shrine Bowl last year.
- Soccer player Carlos Pacheco was named to the Clash of the Carolinas, the SC and NC all-star game for soccer, in 2018.
- The BHS Drama Department scored Excellent in the Palmetto Dramatic Association competition for the second year in a row this year.
