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



Along with creating a school-wide mindfulness moment every morning, we have also created small group student mindfulness groups.

Percentage of Students Passing the End-of-Course Exams



According to the latest school report card:

- The Algebra I End-of-Course passing rate scores have increased 7.8%
- The Biology I End-of-Course passing rate scores have increased 2.7%.
- The English I End-of-Course passing rate scores have decreased 14.4%.
- The US History End-of-Course passing rate scores have decreased 8.7%.
- Passing rates for all EOC tests has decreased by 2.3%. Graduation rate continues to improve, from 74.2% in 2018 to 74.8% 2019.
- ACT Scores increased from a composite score of 15.2 to 16.0
- SAT average score was 854

Demographics indicate that 100% of the school population receive free lunch.

Enrollment has been on the rise within the last 5 years: 2015 (761), 2016 (758), 2017 (741), 2018 (772), and 2019 (849).

School-Wide Learning Outcomes (SWLOs): In the Project-Based Learning environment, students are assessed in the areas of Knowledge & Thinking (50%), Oral Communication (15%), Written Communication (15%), Collaboration (10%), and Agency (10%).

The overall rating for Carolina High School was unsatisfactory for our 2019 Report Card. We only received 35 total points out of 100.
