SIC Annual Goals

1. The Strategic Plan goal (5 yr. cycle) by the year 2027 53% of students in ELA and 47% of students in Math will score at Met or Exemplary level on state testing.

Data Teams continue to analyze student data and best practices teaching to improve student achievement. Read 180 and System 44 Reading Programs continue to provide interventions for at risk students. Math Intervention and Math Lab activity program continues. Improvement was shown in SRI/SMI as well as MAP tests and progress was made in achieving SC Ready goals. Mossy Creek has also become a one to one school, in this we have started a Blended Learning Model in grades 3-5.

2. By Spring 2023 100% of Mossy Creek teachers will maintain highly qualified status.

Staff development was provided for full implementation of ACPSD literacy framework and School Based Leadership Problem Solving model. One hundred percent of Mossy Creek's teachers are highly qualified.

3. By Spring 2023, 95.0% of stakeholders will indicate satisfaction with the learning environment, social and physical environment, and school-home relations as measured by the state report card.

School wide surveys were sent home to parents in the spring of 2023 to measure progress. Teachers, students, and parents indicated satisfaction at the rate of 93%.
