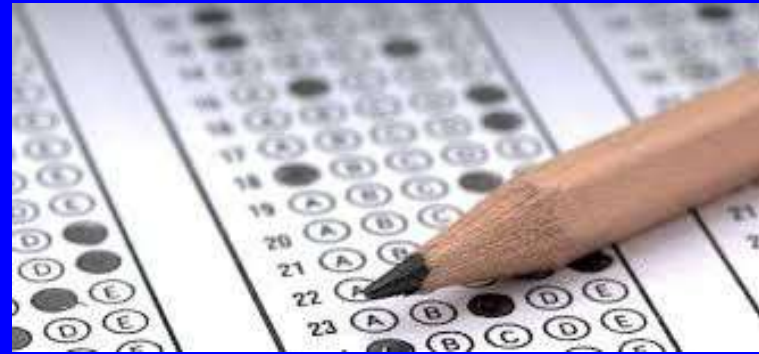
What Sets Us Apart

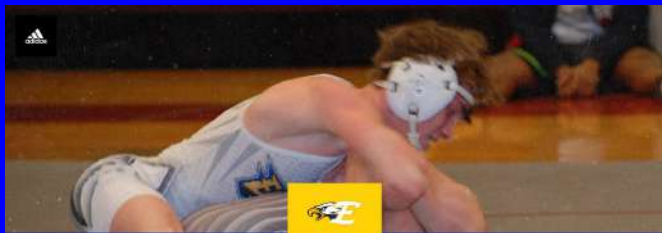

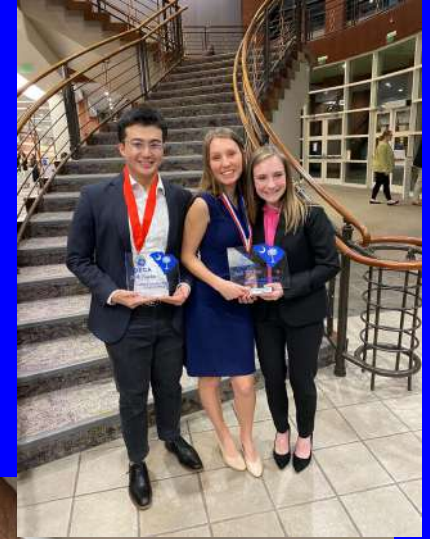

Special Olympics - Special education classes compete in local and state competitions at the Special Olympics March 29, 2023

Peer Tutoring - Students apply in the spring to serve as peer tutors the next school year. Once chosen to be a peer tutor, a student works with the special education class during one class period. This builds a great rapport with our special education students. 18 students served as peer tutors in the 2022-2023 school year.
