
What Sets Us Apart



Peer Tutoring - Students apply in the spring to serve as peer tutors the next school year. Once chosen to be a peer tutor, a student works with the special education class during one class period. This builds a great rapport with our special education students.

Post COVID-19

Fall 2021

- Return to pre-COVID learning
 - GCS still offering virtual academy which is now separate from in person schools
- Greenville County Schools implements district wide Social Emotional Learning curriculum
 - Students meet monthly in advisory classes
 - Counselors lead sessions if a teacher is absent so a trained staff member is facilitating the curriculum instead of a substitute teacher
 - Curriculum contains parent and student resources
 - Students receive prompts to further engage with the curriculum

 - Before school tutoring M-F 7:30-8:30 AM
 - After school tutoring M-Th 3:45-4:45 PM
