ANNUAL REPORT TO THE COMMUNITY



Each SIC is required to write and distribute the annual "Report to the Community" by April 30th of each school year. This report provides us with an excellent opportunity to share Greenville High's successes with the community as we report on the progress made with the school improvement plan.

Throughout the past four years, our school has made continuing progress in the four key areas assessed on the Annual SC School Report Card. These areas include:

- First-time pass rate on the High School Exit Exam (HSAP) or the number of 10th graders who pass all parts of the exam on the first attempt (ended 2013-2014 school year);
- Longitudinal pass rate on HSAP, or the number of students who successfully pass all parts of the exam by 12th grade (ended 2013-2014 school year);
- Pass rate on all End-of-Course Tests, including Algebra 1, Biology 1, English 1, and US History;
- On-time Graduation rate, or the number of students who graduate four years after entering high school.

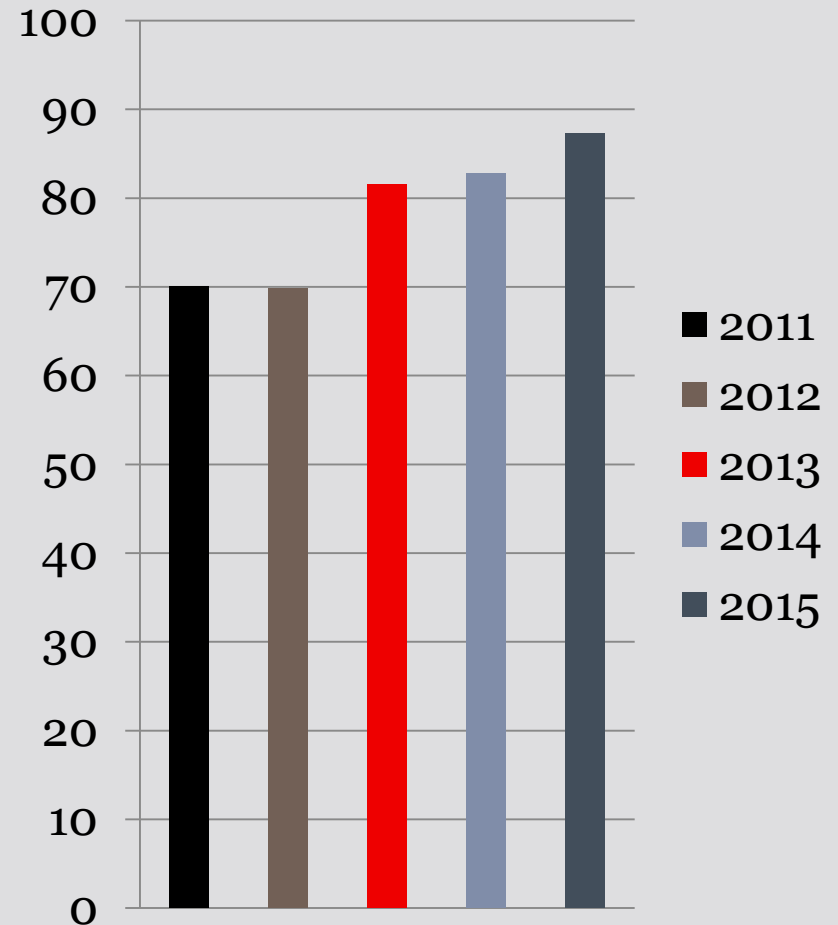

Greenville High School is an inner city school located a few blocks away from the downtown areas of the city of Greenville. Founded in 1776 as a trading center, Greenville was chartered as a city in 1869 and grew to become a leading textile and manufacturing area. Far-sighted leadership kept the city of Greenville viable by recruiting industry and corporate headquarters when retail businesses relocated in the 1950's and 1960's. Today, the city of Greenville is the center of business, entertainment, and culture in the county. A strong revitalization effort of the downtown area is in progress and making great strides.
