
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ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Greenville High School Academy of Law, Finance and Business is a unique specialized program (an extension of Greenville Highis core academic program), with learning-based activities that develop students' understanding of a wide variety of topics and issues. Highlights of the program include a rigorous and relevant curriculum, opportunities for job shadowing and real world experiences such as Mock Trial, Forensics and student-led Credit Union. In addition, college credit can be earned in each focus area.
