Throughout the past four years, our school has made continuing progress in the four key areas assessed on the Annual SC School Report Card. These areas include:

- ❑ First-time pass rate on the High School Exit Exam, HSAP, or the number of 10th graders who pass all parts of the exam on the first attempt
 - ❑ Longitudinal pass rate on HSAP, or the number of students who successfully pass all parts of the exam by 12th grade
 - ❑ Pass rate on all End-of-Course Tests, including Algebra 1, Biology 1, U. S. History, and English 1
 - ❑ On-time Graduation rate, or the number of students who graduate four years after entering high school

 - ❑ Continuation of Early College/Dual Credit with Greenville Technical School classes

 - ❑ Continuation of USA TestPrep math and English intervention program in the Freshman Academy, EOC and HSAP classes
 - ❑ Freshman Academy common planning with teachers' opportunities for continued collaboration, resulting in the continued decrease of 9th grade failures
 - ❑ Named as Top 1500 School by *Newsweek*
 - ❑ 12 AP and 34 Honors classes
 - ❑ Nationally certified and award-winning Project Lead the Way program and Robotics Team
 - ❑ 17 students named as Palmetto Fellow Scholarship recipients for 2012-2013
