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For the fourth consecutive year, Greer High maintained an Absolute rating of Average on the South Carolina School Report Card. The 2010-2011 report card had many positive highlights that will serve to support continued student achievement. Greer High School's retention rate has reduced consistently over the past years. Our plan is to continue reducing the retention rate while maintaining our high standards. The enrollment in AP/IB classes has increased. There was a substantial increase in students qualifying for the Life Scholarship and a decrease in the per cent of drop-outs.

Greer High School's instructional efforts are focused on preparing students for graduation and the 21st century. Course content is aligned to of state learner standards to the various assessments that students face prior to leaving high school: High School Assessment Program, ACT, PSAT, SAT, MAP, and End-of-Course assessments. South Carolina learner standards and expectations for learning have been recognized by many educational experts nationally as being in the top five states in the nation for rigor and challenge. In working with our various stakeholders, teachers, parents, and students it is acknowledged that as the academic bar is raised, additional effort must be expanded in all areas for every student to succeed in meeting higher levels of academic achievement. The 4x4 block schedule continues to afford an opportunity to accelerate achievement for students in need of additional academic assistance in English and mathematics. An extension to the standards includes incorporating "real world" lessons. This year the SIC sponsored "Career Thursday" with representatives from Sun Trust Bank, J Harley Bonds Career Center, and UCS Upstate visiting classrooms. This endeavor reached 264 students.


Efforts continue to improving graduation rates at Greer High School. Academic opportunities that are available to students include Virtual School, Twilight School, and Seat Time Recovery. Students identified as at-risk have additional support with Classworks, a prescriptive math and ELA program, during the school day and before school. Greer High Faculty and Staff continue to utilize data reports for in-depth analysis of educational performance trends over time with the primary goal being continuous improvement. Greer High is an International Baccalaureate School, as well as a member of the Southern Regional Educational Board's High Schools That Work. Best practices from both reform efforts serve as the foundation for continuous improvement for every student's success. Greer High School is committed to providing each and every student the most rigorous, challenging educational opportunity possible.

High School Assessment Program (HSAP) First-Time Pass Rate






