

A History of Excellence

J.L. Mann High School has a longstanding history of excellence in education and Patriot pride amongst our students. J.L. Mann High school was established on July 1, 1965 after being named after Dr. James Lewis Mann who was a former superintendent of Greenville County Schools. Because of Dr. Mann's dedicated service to education in Greenville, the newly constructed high school on Isbell Lane was named in his honor. Formerly, Ridge Road Junior and Senior High had served the students in our area. The first principal of J.L. Mann High School was Mr. Larkin Bruce, and the front office displays a plaque in his honor. Dr. Shannon Gibson now serves as our principal for the 2022-23 school year.

J.L. Mann became a magnet academy of Math, Science and Technology in the fall of 1997. Currently, approximately 30 percent of enrolled students are in the magnet academy. J. L. Mann has grown in many ways and continues to innovate and seeks to successfully serve all of our students. The school is constantly adding new classes and programs to expand opportunities for our students. J.L. Mann provides rigorous academics to include both AP and college dual credit course work. Additionally, we have an expansive fine arts program as well as a New Tech program which is project based learning for our students. Students also have opportunities to attend the career center for hands-on job training. We have an active ROTC program at J.L. Mann and our athletics program proudly competes at the AAAAA level and has won many state championships over the years.

J. L. Mann continues to value our longstanding traditions such as Homecoming, Prom, Spirit Week, and Talismann Day for our seniors. J.L. Mann High School expanded and moved to the current location in December 2007. A new addition was opened in the summer of 2017 for the New Tech project based learning model. J. L. Mann is a place of many opportunities and accomplishments, and the students and faculty support each other in these many varied and diverse interests.
