### A History of Excellence

The history of our proud high school dates back

to July 1, 1965, when it first opened. It was named after a former superintendent of Greenville County Schools, James Lewis Mann. Because of Dr. Mann's service to education in Greenville, the Greenville County School District Trustees in 1965 approved the naming of the school under construction known at the time as Ridge Road Junior and Senior High, as "J.L. Mann High School."

The first principal was Mr. Larkin Bruce. After Mr. Bruce retired, Ronald Siefred became principal. Milton Diehl and Rudolph Gordon, fol-lowed him. Dr. Bill Stubbs became principal after Dr. Gordon. David Vickery became principal in 1984. Then, Mr. Fred Crawford followed him in 1989 to 2000. In May 2001, Mrs. Susan Hughes was named principal and most recently, Mr. Charles Mayfield became our current principal starting in the 2009-2010 school year.

J.L. Mann became a magnet academy of Math, Science and Technology in the fall of 1997. About 30 percent of enrolled students are magnet academy students.

J. L. Mann has changed in many ways. The leadership is constantly adding new classes. J. L. Mann is a oneto-one school where every student is issued a district Chromebook. J. L. Mann continues to value the longstanding traditions at J. L. Mann such as Homecoming, Prom, Spirit Week and the Talismann Pageant.

The facility moved to their current location in December 2007 and opened a new addition in the summer of 2017 that is built for project based learning.
