
Mission Statement:

J. L. Mann's students continue to excel in a variety of ways. Our seniors continue to exceed expectations. This year we had 51 Palmetto Fellows and 63 students receive the Life Scholarship. In total, our seniors self-reported a total of \$11,646,000 in scholarships.

Academically our students continue to improve and excel. J. L. Mann continues to provide academic assistance to promote achievement through numerous initiatives. The school has moved to one-to-one technology with Chromebooks



being provided to every student. The Power of M and after school transportation and tutoring programs continue to be successful supporting achievement by reducing the number of students failing courses school wide. Additionally, students have the opportunity to achieve academic success by participating in programs such as Accelerate, NewTech@Mann, Magnet, Fine Arts Center, and Golden Strip Career Center. J. L. JL Mann PTSA was the largest PTA in the state of South Carolina for the 2018-19 school year. We have a long history of supporting the students, parents and teachers of JL Mann through our membership, donations to Patriot Partners and the Patriot Pantry. We awarded over \$20,000 in mini-grants to teachers, reimbursed over \$5000 worth of classroom supplies, awarded \$2500 in Academic Extra Curricular Support, and donated over 9200 volunteer hours. JL Mann PTSA also hosted a parent program on Teen Anxiety and Depression, our Red Ribbon Week concentrated on vaping and juuling and we treated our staff to a week of recharging and refreshing for Staff Appreciation Week. As part of our effort to help parents stay in communication with the school, we produced a bi-weekly e-newsletter, published 2 newsletters that were mailed home to every family and posted important events on the PTSA Facebook page and website. 2018-2019 was another exciting year for J.L. Mann athletics. We had 800 student athletes on rosters of 36 different teams in 21 sports. In the last year, nineteen teams made the playoffs or qualified for state competitions. This year seven teams claimed Region championships. Individually, we had 30 athletes named all region and one named Region Player of the Year for the Fall and Winter Seasons. We had four All-State players and four players named to their sports North/South or All Star games. J.L. Mann had fourteen athletes sign to continue their athletic careers at the next level. Our athletic teams also excelled academically. We had 16 teams with an average GPA over a 4.0 and a total team average of 4.08.

Spirit Week at J.L. Mann

The 2018-2019 student body led the way to an excellent example of Patriot Pride. The J.L. Mann community raised over \$184,000 to benefit the Meyer Center. The Meyer Center is a locally owned and run center for children with various disabilities to receive treatment as well as education. The Meyer Center remains dedicated to enriching the lives of children with disabilities so that they might reach their full potential. A small portion of the money was used to support the After-School Transportation Program, which provides every student at J.L. Mann with an opportunity to stay for after-school help or tutoring. All this money was raised through a variety of student-directed activities and will all go to these two programs.
