Patriots Lead the Way

Academically, JL Mann continues to advance the achievement of all our students. For the second year in a row JL Mann was recognized as a Palmetto Gold School. JL Mann was also recently recognized as an Energy Star School for energy efficiency. The Class of 2012 received \$5,305,450 in higher education scholarships, recognized 27 Palmetto Fellows, 2 National Merit Finalists, 3 national Merit Letter of Commendations, 15 Sirrine Scholars, and 61 AP Scholars. The SC State Department of Education awarded Mann the "Magna Cum Laude" Award for excellent performance and rapid growth on the ACT/SAT. JL Mann has 7 Nationally Board Certified teachers. A comprehensive new Power of M program was established this year offering assistance in entry level courses. This, along with our after school transportation program, has helped us to see a significant decrease in the number of failures in 9th grade classes.

JL Mann had a very successful year in athletics. We had 513 male athletes compete on 21 different teams and 291 female athletes played on 16 different teams. This is a combined total of 804 athletes spread across 37 teams. We had 4 state champions including: women's track, women's lacrosse, men's tennis and men's soccer. We also had two individual state champions in men's tennis and women's cross country. JL Mann had 24 athletes sign to continue their athletic career at the next level. These athletic accomplishments were over shadowed by a school wide athletic GPA of 3.86. Our athletes excelled on the field and in the classroom.

Spirit Week

The 2012-2013 student body truly exemplified Patriot Pride. Efforts during Spirit Week raised \$117,367 for Project Hope, Challenge Day and JL Mann's After-School Transportation Program. All monies went directly to these charities, and were raised through a variety of student-directed activities.
