On Track at MHS

MHS OnTrack program is in its 5th year addressing academic, attendance, and behavior concerns, meeting weekly to review students at risk. The team works with admin, teachers, staff and community members to work with identified students in increasing positive behaviors, improving grades, and minimizing attendance issues. Students are matched with teacher mentors, mental health and social service resources, provided tutoring opportunities, as well as increased check-ins with their counselors, small groups, and home visits. We are on track to have several students that wouldn't have graduated receive their diplomas on time for 2024 due to Ontrack services.

School Profile

Mauldin High School is among the district's and state-wide leaders in academic achievement. The school has among the district's highest passing averages on the End-Of-Course assessments. Our graduation rate, which ranks at the top in Greenville County, is among the top in South Carolina. Of the graduating class, 500+ students graduated as college and career ready, as per the SC state standards.

The Class of 2023 earned scholarships totaling \$32.9 million, including 47 students recognized as Palmetto Fellow recipients and a National Merit Finalist. Advanced Placement exams were administered to 600+ students who took more than 1000 Advanced Placement exams. Our academic program is supported by dynamic counseling and career development staff who meet with each student multiple times a year to evaluate academic progress and review college and career plans.

Mauldin High school was first built in 1973 and renovated in 2002. Our campus is home to a wide variety of instructional, athletic, extracurricular, and lifelong learning programs. Despite the size of our student body, our school provides a welcoming and nurturing environment to all students.

Mauldin High School is located in one of the state's fastest-growing areas, and it is situated on the edge of a major research complex that brings high-tech jobs to the community. Our school is charged with providing students with the essential academic and social skills that will provide them a place in the global economy of the 21st century, consistent with the district's goals of producing college and career graduates. #GoMAVS
