On Track @ MHS

MHS OnTrack program is in its 3rd year addressing academic, attendance, and behavior concerns, meeting weekly to review students at risk. Even with the struggles of this COVID year successes were found by bringing 21 atrisk students back into the classroom, improving grades, and minimizing attendance issues. Students are matched with teacher mentors, mental health and social service resources, provided tutoring opportunities, as well as increased check-ins with their counselors, small groups, and home visits. Last year we had 5 students that wouldn't have graduated, receive their diploma on time due to Ontrack services and we expect to top this number for our 2021 graduation.

The South Carolina Department of Ed did not rate schools in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. MHS did earn an excellent rating on the 2019 SC School Report Card. Beyond this recognition, it is a place where teaching and learning are front in center in everything we do and where establishing positive relationships between all stakeholders marks the way. 




