SIC Goals and Improvement Strategies:

Southside High School has implemented several strategies to improve student achievement this year. The SIC receives regular updates on these important initiatives:

- Teachers provide extra academic support for seniors working to pass HSAP as well as to stay motivated and engaged. In 2013-14, the test prep coordinator worked with Juniors and Seniors to facilitate their success on the HSAP.
- The administration identified students whose academic performance suggests they would benefit from GCSD's Life Long Learning program, and PTSA provided funding so that students in danger of not graduating could transfer to the program, which provides flexible instruction and special attention to the needs of at-risk students.
- The administration manages record keeping via a database —for test results as well as enrollment and withdrawal dates--to insure that students are on track for graduation, whether at Southside or another school.
- The Freshmen Academy is in its sixth year of full implementation. Assistant Principal Justin Ludley works closely with a team of teachers to implement programming throughout the year to ensure that all freshmen have opportunities to succeed. Benchmark testing and incentives have been used during the school year to gauge student understanding and reward academic progress.
