The Student Council was also recognized as being in the top two councils in the state for the eleventh consecutive year and was named a National Gold Honor Council for the seventh time. Athletically, we continue to experience growth in our success, with multiple playoff berths, region championships, and several all state and North-South team members. Of course, we cannot forget our individual State Champions in Girls Tennis and Girls Golf. Additionally, we had students recognized as the state Player of the Year in Girls Tennis and Boys Basketball.

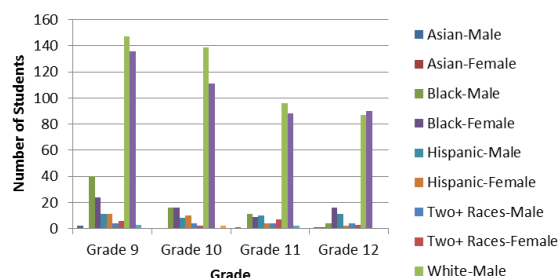
