We have accepted the challenge of standardized testing for our juniors and plan to again demonstrate our excellence when the results of the ACT and Work Keys are announced in the fall. Over 92% of our juniors passed the Work Keys assessment last year and we were above the state average in ACT scores. Our collaboration with Greenville Tech has continued to produce great results, preparing even more students for their education beyond high school in offering college credit classes on our campus. This program makes Travelers Rest High one of a few schools in Greenville County to offer three different college level programs (IB, AP, and Dual Credit) to meet the differing, rigorous academic needs for our students.

Additionally, our extra-curricular activities have expanded and have experienced significant success. Our BETA Club students have again qualified for national level competition and our fine art department continues to win multiple state level awards. Our Student Council demonstrated our strength in student leadership by continuing to raise an amazing amount of money for charity during our December toy drive and our annual Spirit Week. The Student Council was also recognized as being in the top two councils in the state for the eleventh consecutive year and was named a National Gold Honor Council for the eighth time. Athletically, we continue to experience growth in our success, with multiple playoff berths, region championships, and several all state and North-South team members. Of course, we cannot forget our individual State Champions in Girls Golf with the team winning state runner up honors. Additionally, our football team recorded its first winning season in many years and looks to continue its positive growth.

As always, we maintain a commitment to continuous improvement. We study our school wide data on a constant basis and make the necessary adjustments to our instructional program. Looking toward the 2016-17 school year, we are making the necessary adjustments to maintain our quality educational program in the face of continued budget reductions.

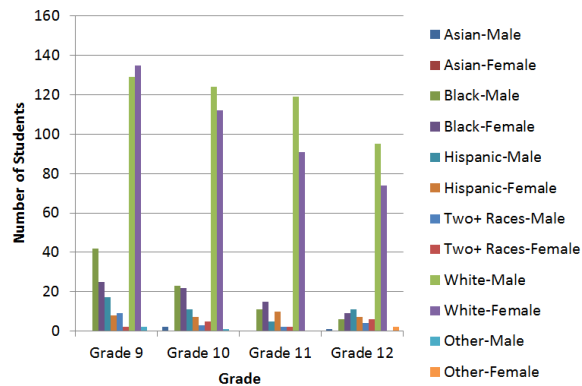
