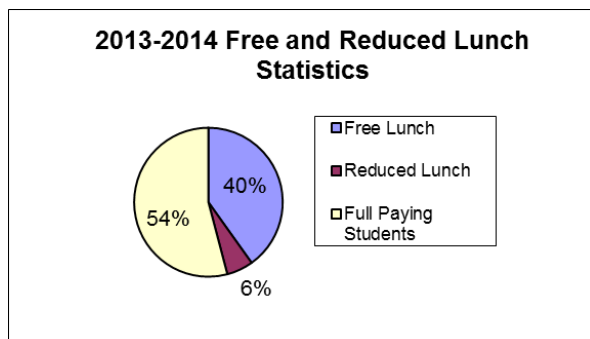
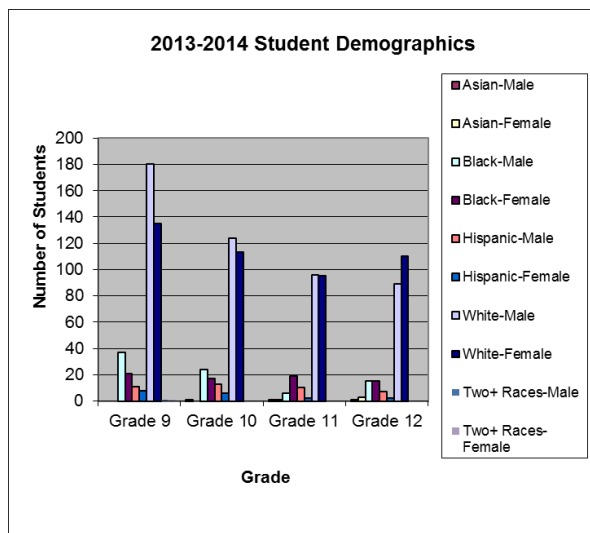

Our Student Council demonstrated our strength in student leadership by continuing to raise amazing amount of money for charity during our December toy drive and our annual Spirit Week. The Student Council was also recognized as being in the top two councils in the state for the tenth consecutive year and was named a National Gold Honor Council for the sixth time. Athletically, we continue to experience growth in our success, with multiple playoff berths, region championships, and several all state and North-South team members. Of course, we cannot forget our State Champion Girls Tennis Team and our State Champion AAAA-AAA Girls Individual Tennis Player.

As always, we maintain a commitment to continuous improvement. We study our school wide data on a constant basis and make the necessary adjustments to our instructional program. Looking toward the 2014-15 school year, we are making the necessary adjustments to maintain our quality educational program in the face of significant and continued budget reductions.
