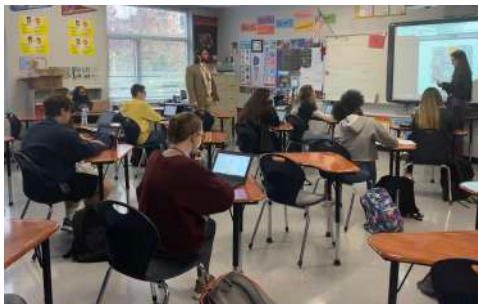


## HISTORY
