

Woodmont High School
Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Woodmont High School is an International Baccalaureate World School and one of 14 high schools in the School District of Greenville County. Our state-of-the art facility boasts nearly 300,000 square feet and is situated on a picturesque 69 acre campus in rural southern Greenville County. The school serves a diverse population of nearly 1,800 students (68% white, 25% African American, 5% Hispanic, and 2% other) in grades 9-12. The school's Poverty Index is currently at 63% with approximately half of all students participating in the Free & Reduced Lunch Program. Woodmont High features a strong and experienced staff of administrators and teachers with a five year staff retention rate of 95 percent. More than half of the faculty have advanced degrees. The distinguished faculty includes award-winning individuals such as the District Teacher of the Year, SC Bar Association Mock Trial Teacher of the Year, SC Outstanding Young Agriculture Educator of the Year, Mentor Teacher of the Year and the SC Governor's Council on Physical Fitness Individual Award Teacher. Fifteen members of the faculty are National Board Certified Teachers.

The SIC proposed six focus points for the 2014-15 school year and successfully implemented four. Focus areas of class size, parent and community awareness and education programs, effective mentoring and weekend nutritional programs were supported and received wide acclaim. The remaining focal points of graduation rate improvement and academic and career opportunities will be the primary area of focus for the upcoming year.
