Annual Report to the Community 2018

We are very excited to continue this in-house training next year, as we bring the very best instruction to our Gators. None of our goals would become realities for our gators if it were not for our fabulous community, PTA and SIC members!

Thanks to your support, we have been able to assure that every student at gateway will have a personal Chromebook for the 2018-19 school year! You may recall that our Cliff's Neighborhood Outreach Program gifted every classroom with a Chromebook charging cart to further assist the ease of one to one technology implementation. We cannot find words to express enough sincere appreciation for their continued support of our Gators. Additionally, we are in the process of installing our very first climbing wall! This was a huge effort this year and every single stakeholder worked together to assure that our Gators would again receive an unbelievable gift. School Climate

Goal 4: Maintain at least a 96.8% attendance rate for all students and all student sub groups from 2012 through 2018.

Teacher and Administrator Quality

Goal 5: Maintain 100% of teachers as highly qualified from 2012-2018. Objective: Continue to meet qualification criteria for 100% of teachers in all areas of certification.

The school renewal plan includes elements required by the Early Childhood Development and Academic Assistance Act of 1993 (Act 135) and the Education Accountability Act of 1998 (EAA). We revise, monitor progress and adjust our goals within the plan annually in collaboration with our school faculty and staff, and our SIC (School Improvement Council).

Lastly, I feel that it is only fitting to again share our core values and beliefs. Our values and beliefs are the core of who we are, what we do, and how we think and feel. Values and beliefs reflect what is important to us; they describe what we think about educating our children, while continuing the focus of remembering that the hearts and minds of our children are of equal importance.
