Parent conferences are held quarterly. Parents attend quarterly "Lunch and Learn" workshops on a variety of topics and monthly "Coffee with the Principal" meetings. English classes are offered at Alexander to non-English speaking parents to bridge the communication gap between home and school. Additionally, parents are involved in the development of our school wide Title 1 Plan.

Alexander received an Unsatisfactory Report Card Rating for 2007-2008 and a Below Average for 2010-2011. The students met 15 / 23 objectives for "Annual Yearly Progress" for 2010-2011 and 23 / 23 objectives for 2009-2010. Our school has not made AYP for the last five consecutive years, thus placing Alexander in Plan for Restructure status.

In 2011, Alexander met 15 out of 23 objectives. Unfortunately, our school did not make AYP. We had a Below Average absolute report card rating and an Average report card rating.

We are proud to have such a dedicated team of students, parents, community leaders, faculty, and staff, who work together to make Alexander Elementary soar high!
