## Student Achievement



Our school, Brook Glenn Elementary, currently serves 460 culturally diverse preK-5 students (43% white, 23% Hispanic, 21% Black, 5% Asian, 7% two or more races). 70% of students receive free or reduced lunch. 18.6% of our students participate in the ESOL program, and 15% receive special education services, including speech. Brook Glenn's 2010-11 School Absolute Rating was 'average' and the Improvement rating 'average,' decreasing our status from the previous year. The school has met AYP status 8 out of 9 years.
