Student Achievement

Brook Glenn serves an ethnically, diversely, rich population of 452 students comprised of 53% minority (26% African American, 15% Hispanic; 5% Asian, 7% Other) and 47% Caucasian students; 65% receive subsidized meals; 5% are Talented and Gifted; 23% Special Education; 18% ESOL; and 24% Special Permission students. The socioeconomic, academic, and cultural diversity of the population present both a great challenge and opportunity and require innovation at every level.
