## Student Achievement



Our school, Brook Glenn Elementary, currently serves 472 culturally diverse preK-5 students (43% white, 23% Hispanic, 21% Black, 5% Asian, 7% two or more races). 68% of students receive free or reduced lunch. 18.6% of our students participate in the ESOL program, and 15% receive special education services, including speech. Brook Glenn's 2012 – 2013 School Absolute Rating was **Good** and the Improvement rating **Average**. Brook Glenn received a National Report Card Rating of 95.7 / A.
