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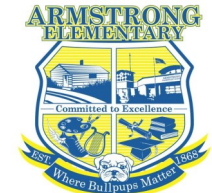

## Armstrong Elementary School Accomplishments

Armstrong Elementary provided many opportunities to support the academic success of students. We continued our implementation of Balanced Literacy practices school wide. We also continued our Response to Intervention (RTI) program which supports at-risk readers in kindergarten through second grade. We offer morning and afternoon tutoring in reading and math for students in third through fifth grade. We continue to support our students with a literacy specialist, and a full-time GT and enrichment educator.

All of the student in grades K-5 are assigned a personalized device to access online educational resources. Throughout the year, student learning experiences are enhanced through the use of various technological tools and programs such as Promethean Boards, Chromebooks, and document cameras. We also provide instructional technology using SeeSaw, Google Apps, Flowcabulary, SeeSaw, ILX, Book Creator, BrainPop and EdPuzzle.

We incorporated Growth Mindset across the school and within our guidance lessons. The Acting Right program empowered students to take ownership of and be responsible for their own behavior.

We promoted parent involvement through, but not limited to, PTA nights, Pumpkin Palooza Math Night, Family/Student Tutoring, Literacy Night, Motown Review, and a Talent Show.
