# Armstrong Elementary School Recognitions and Accomplishments

Armstrong Elementary provided many opportunities to support the academic success of students. We continued our implementation of Balanced Literacy practices school wide. We also continued our Response to Intervention (Rtl) program which supports at-risk readers in kindergarten through second grade. We continue to support our students with literacy specialist, as well as after school tutorials to support our reading and math instructional programs.

At the intermediate level, we offered an after school STEM enrichment program as well as Career Enrichment clubs to help students build social, world-class, and life-long learning skills. Two support classes have been added for students with disabilities.

Throughout the year, student learning experiences were enhanced through the use of various technological tools and programs such as Compass Learning, Promethean Boards, English in a Flash, Reading Eggs, Learning A-Z, Reading Counts, Mountain Math, ActivExpressions, internet accessible computers, Chrome Books and iPads.
