

Augusta Circle Elementary School (ACE) is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate by providing a safe, caring, and academically challenging learning environment. We provide such an environment through the implementation of our school vision: a school that has a "Legacy of Excellence and Leadership." ACE is a National Blue Ribbon School of Excellence, a Palmetto's Finest School, and a Red Carpet school. The school offers a rigorous academic program and continues to maintain high expectations for all its students. Our teachers implement continuous improvement by adopting new and effective strategies in the classroom such as: balanced literacy, Every Day Counts Mathematics, project learning in science and social studies, and writing across the curriculum. We have additional support from our literacy specialist, resource teacher, speech teacher, and instructional coach. At Augusta Circle we also have other programs outside the academic environment. Schoolwide we focused on embedding the 7 Habits of Healthy Kids in all that we do. Our guidance counselor taught the 7 Habits in monthly classroom guidance lessons and teachers helped students practice them throughout the day. Partnerships with Mentor Greenville and Club House Kids have provided access for students to mentors, homework assistance, and social activities. The PTA organized six service projects, a family outreach program for ACE at-risk students and a week long, in-depth study of Argentina. Our music teacher organized a 4th and 5th grade chorus that practiced after school and performed in school and community-based events. Students interested in gardening participated after school in our CATCH Patch garden. 2014-2015 was another exciting and successful school year. We won our eleventh state Palmetto Gold award because our PASS achievement score was Excellent. We won our eleventh Attendance Blitz Award for having the Overall Highest Daily Attendance of any school in the district. Multiple field trips and school-based projects were made possible through grant funding from Whole Foods, the Metropolitan Arts Council, LiveWell Greenville, and the Target Foundation. 


The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing
