Primary Years Program

Sara Collins Elementary School was authorized as the first IB PYP school in Greenville County in 2004. We completed the five-year self-study in 2007 and 2012. The next site visit will be in the fall of 2017.

The Mission of the IB program is to “develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help to create a better world through intercultural understanding and respect.” Students learn about their own culture and beliefs, and learn to recognize others’ perspectives. Curriculum is organized under six large themes. Students are encouraged to take responsible action in response to their learning. Students reflect on and assess their role as learners using the attributes of the Learner Profile: ***Inquirers, Thinkers, Communicators, Risk-takers, Knowledgeable, Principled, Caring, Open-minded, Well-balanced, and Reflective.***

IB students develop and practice the IB Attitudes in the community as well as at school. The IB attitudes are ***Empathy, Tolerance, Integrity, Curiosity, Enthusiasm, Independence, Confidence, Appreciation, Commitment, Respect, Creativity, and Cooperation.***
