## Our Why ...

Plain Elementary opened its doors for the first time in 1982 and proudly welcomed 652 students ranging from kindergarten through fifth grade. The building was constructed on land, that many years ago, surrounded a stagecoach and mail delivery stop in what was then a small rural pioneer community. The school's name reflects the rich history of the community it serves.

The school facility has changed over the years. Initially, portable classrooms were added to alleviate overcrowding as the student population soared during the 1990's. A decade later, an expansion and renovation of the original building was deemed necessary. Construction was completed in 2006 to support one thousand students.

We continue to maintain high expectations for all students by implementing research-based instructional practices to meet the needs of every child. Our community's goal is to build strong academic, social, and emotional foundational skills for our children. Continuous school-wide improvement and a voice in the educational process are valued by our citizens. A safe learning environment which cultivates mutual respect is paramount to our school family.

Our School Improvement Council (SIC) continues to work with TreesGreenville to beautify school grounds through our annual "Hands on Plain Elementary (HOPE) Day. They also have planned our fourth annual Panda 5k run & walk for the spring.

From the original school mission, "Blazing Trails from the Future," to our present vision, "A School Family - Positively Committed to Excellence," we embrace our past and future while striving to make a positive impact in the lives of our students, parents, staff, and community members. We are a collaborative school family and have a dynamic, thriving learning community.
