We opened its doors for the first time in August 1982 and proudly welcomed 652 students ranging from kindergarten through fifth grade. The building was constructed on land that many years ago surrounded a stage coach and mail delivery stop in what was then the small rural pioneer community. The school's name reflects the rich history of the community it serves.

The school facility has changed over the years. Initially, portable classrooms were added to alleviate overcrowding as the student population soared during the 1990's. A decade later, an expansion and renovation of the original building was deemed necessary. Construction was completed in 2006 to support one thousand students.

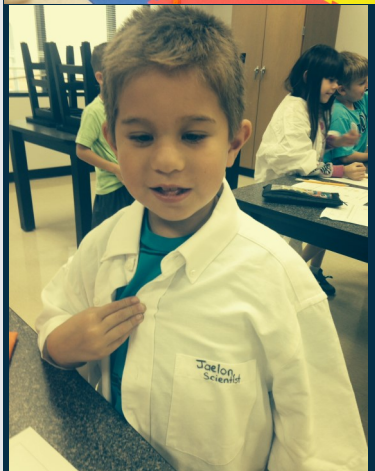
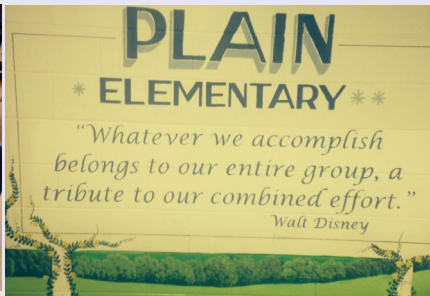
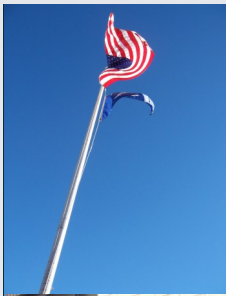
