## Duncan Chapel Performance Goals

#### **PERFORMANCE GOAL 1**

For the 2012- 2013 school year 79.4% of students in grades 3 - 5 will meet standard in ELA. In order to achieve this goal, the total number of students who are at met or exemplary will increase by 3%.

#### **PERFORMANCE GOAL 2**

For the 2012-2013 school year 79% of students in grades 3-5 will meet standard in math. In order to achieve this goal, the total number of students who are at met or exemplary will increase by 3%.

We will also maintain the expectation that students will achieve their targeted RIT scores on the MAP testing for Math and Reading, with at least 80% of students accomplishing this goal. This will include grades 2-5.

100% of students in Kindergarten and First Grade will demonstrate improvement in the areas of reading, math, and writing, as determined by District Benchmarks.

# Duncan Chapel Maintains Title I Status for 2012-2013

Duncan Chapel Elementary School received Title I funding for the 2012-2013 school year. This funding was granted based on the school's percentage of students who received free and reduced lunch.

As a result of this Title I status, Duncan Chapel was able to sustain lower studentteacher ratios in multiple grade levels, provide additional support for students in math and reading through the RTI program, hire an additional instructional coach for the primary grades, and provide much needed instructional supplies like books, learning games, and math manipulatives that directly benefitted our students. Title I funding also provided professional development for the teaching staff, and provided many opportunities for parents to receive training and to be more involved in the experience of public education. Additionally, Title I funding provided a bilingual parent involvement coordinator to better bridge relationship between home and school.

At present, Duncan Chapel is preparing its Title I Plan for the 2013-2014 school year. Final information about funding allocations and plans for expenditures will be available to all stakeholders when the new school year begins in August.
