Duncan Chapel Performance Goals

PERFORMANCE GOAL 1

The 2016 spring MAP results indicate that 58.9% (228 out of 387) of 2nd through 5th grade students reached their Target RIT on the MAP math assessment. Therefore we did reach our goal of maintaining or increasing the previous year's percentage (57.5%) of students who reached their Target RIT. In addition, we surpassed the 2016 district math MAP average of 48.8%, a difference of 10.1%. We have continued to maintain a high level of achievement as indicated by our 3-year math MAP average (58%).

PERFORMANCE GOAL 2

The spring MAP results indicate that 57.6% (223 out of 387) of 2nd through 5th grade students reached their Target RIT on the MAP reading assessment. Therefore we did not reach our goal of maintaining the previous year's percentage (59.8%) of students who reached their Target RIT. While these results are lower than expected, we have maintained a high average of students meeting or exceeding their Target RIT as indicated by our 3-year average (60.1%), and have consistently exceeded the district percentage (2016=54%; 3-year average=53.6%).

Duncan Chapel Maintains Title I Status for 2015-2016

Duncan Chapel Elementary School received Title I funding for the 2015-2016 school year.

As a result of this Title I status, Duncan Chapel was able to sustain lower studentteacher ratios in multiple grade levels, provided additional support for students in math and reading through the RTI program, hire an additional instructional coach for the primary grades, extension of the afterschool tutoring program for at-risk second graders through Communities in Schools, and provide much needed instructional and technology supplies that directly benefit our students. Title I also provided professional funding development for the teaching staff, and provided many opportunities for parents to receive training and to be more involved in the experience of public education. Title I funding also provided a bilingual parent involvement coordinator to better bridge the relationship between home and school.

Duncan Chapel is in the final stages of preparing the Title I Plan for the 2016-2017 school year. Final information about funding allocations and plans for expenditures will be available to all stakeholders when the new school year begins in August.
