Lake Forest Performance Goals

PERFORMANCE GOAL 1:

Increase the percentage of students meeting standard in English Language Arts (reading and research) as measured by the Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (PASS) from 78.1% in 2012 to 83.1% in 2018. In order to achieve this goal, the total number of students who are at met or exemplary will increase by 1% annually.

PERFORMANCE GOAL 2:

Increase the percentage of students meeting standard (Met and Exemplary) in writing as measured by the Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (PASS) from 77.6% in 2012 to 82.6% in 2018. In order to achieve this goal, the total number of students who are at met or exemplary will increase by at least 1% annually.

PERFORMANCE GOAL 3:

Increase the percentage of students meeting standard in mathematics as measured by the Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (PASS) from 77.4% in 2012 to 82.4% in 2018. In order to achieve this goal, the total number of students who are at met or exemplary will increase by 1% annually.

ITBS Goal-Second Grade:

Annually meet or exceed the national norm of 50th percentile in each subtest of the Iowa Tests of Basic Skills (ITBS) in grade 2.

Kindergarten and First Grade Goals:

In the 2013-2014 school year, 100% of kindergarten and first grade students will show measurable growth in the subject area of Reading/ELA and Math as determined by District Benchmarks.
