LMS Academic Progress

From our most recent data in the spring of 2019, students took the SCREADY for English Language Arts and Math, SCPASS for 6th grade Science and over half of our student body took the ACCESS for English Language Learners. The test results demonstrated improvement in many areas. On the ELA Assessment for grades 6-8, 20.2% met or exceeded expectations. In the Math Assessment, 17% met or exceeded expectations. There is a direct correlation between the number of students who need support in reading, and for many, English Language acquisition and their scores on standardized tests. In 2019, we had 356 students in the English Learner sub group. Of 260 assessed students on the ACCESS for ELLs, 57 met progress toward proficiency targets. This was a full percentage point higher than the previous year. The results indicate that for all students to achieve at higher levels, acquiring academic vocabulary will continue to be a top concern. Our teachers are continuously working on making this happen for 100% of our student body including our ELL students. To that end, we continue to vigorously address the needs of students who are reading below grade level.
