#### **READING RESOURCES**

SIC created a reading resource guide containing activities and specific community/online resources for books. The guide was distrubted during MES Reading Night and is available in the front office.

#### **READING SURVEY**

To continue to assist with student access to books, SIC created and distributed a parent/student survey about in-home reading habits and individual student access to books outside of school.

#### **BOOK VENDING MACHINE**

After securing a grant late last year for the vending machine, SIC is increasing student access to books at home. This year every student is able to earn book machine tokens and choose a book, throughout the school year in a variety of different ways, including:

- Birthdays (beginning in 2023)
- Meeting Reading WIGs (Wildly Important Goals)
- Earning Student of the Week

### SCHOOL-WIDE READING SCORES HAVE INCREASED YEAR OVER YEAR FROM 2020 THROUGH 2023

Over the last 3 years, MES SIC has partnered with liaisons, generous grant donors, and community members to execute a series of reading initiatives and events to inspire a love of reading for students and encouraging daily reading habits. In the spring of 2022, on the SC Ready Assessment, 58% of MES students met or exceeded expectation in reading. Additionally, 59% of MES students met or exceeded expectation in math. Both of these percentages are above district average and are higher than the previous year's scores!

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
